To the Saints at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church: Well, Halloween, Veterans Day, and Thanksgiving are now over. So, now we can start thinking and preparing for the Celebration of our Lord's birth: Yes, Christmas, the anniversary Christmas! celebration of our Lord's birth. Now I know for some this newsletter will seem late. After all, the stores have been decorated for Christmas since the last after, after, after Christmas sale ended back in July. I also know that many of you Christmasaholics have been decorating trees, watching the Christmas programs on the Hallmark Channel and listening to Christmas carols since mid-October. However, most of us non-fanatics are just now getting around to planning our Christmas holiday.

We are planning what gifts we will buy for those that we love. We do this as an imitation of the magi who brought gifts to the newly born Jesus in Bethlehem (Matthew 2:12). Some of us are going further, contemplating and designing in what ornate way we are going to decorate our houses in festive lights. Which is an imitation of the star that guided the magi to Bethlehem to the newborn King (Matthew 2:2). All the while, we are buying things and putting up lights, we are planning to put up a Christmas tree in honor of....wait that is not in the Bible! Why do we put up a pine tree with lights in our homes during Christmas time? It is not in the Bible. There are not many, if any, Douglas Firs in Bethlehem! So what gives? Why do we keep this tradition?

Well, like so many of our Christmas traditions we have Germany to thank. According to the History Channel "Germany is credited with starting the Christmas tree tradition as we now know it in the 16th century when devout Christians brought decorated trees into their homes. Some built Christmas pyramids of wood and decorated them with evergreens and candles if wood was scarce. It is a widely held belief that Martin Luther, the 16th-century Protestant reformer, first added lighted candles to a tree.

Walking toward his home one winter evening, composing a sermon, he was awed by the brilliance of stars twinkling amidst evergreens. To recapture the scene for his family, he erected a tree in the main room and wired its branches with lighted candles."

It is from Germany that the Christmas tree tradition came to America via German immigrants to Pennsylvania where the first examples of them are found in lithographs from the 1830's. From there they spread across America where they are now a mainstay of American Christmas.

Now, the Christmas tree might not be found in the Bible, but it does remind us of two important truths; That Christ brings life into our homes and our lives even when our lives are cold, barren, and seeming devoid of life. While the lights we adorn them with remind us that He is the Light of the World; A light, which no darkness can overcome.

As a symbol, this is powerful. Therefore, while this might not be a "Biblical" tradition as certain tiresome people tell us, it is certainly a tradition that a Christian can keep. Because anything that reminds us that Jesus breathes into us new life and light is a good thing. Remember, traditions are fine if they support a Biblical truth, and this tree trimming tradition certainly does that!

So beloved, trim your trees, or if you have had them up since before Halloween, remember to water them. Because a dry Christmas is a natural fuel air bomb! However, always remember why you are doing so. Not for some weird pagan fertility ritual, but rather to remind yourself of the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, who breathes life into us and is a light to our cold, dark world. Amen.

CRUISE OPPORTUNITY


