

Beloved in the Lord, we are now in the middle of Lent. As we are all aware, Lent is the season of repentance. The time when we recall our sins, repent of them and strive to do better, secure in the knowledge that our salvation is assured because of what Jesus Christ did for us on the Cross of Calvary. We all "get" this part of Lent. However, there is another part of Lent as well, the reconciliation part. Not only reconciliation between God and man, but between man and man. Now the Church does a good job of announcing and effecting reconciliation between God and man. After all, we have the Word and Sacrament to do that for us. However, because we are human, we struggle to affect reconciliation between ourselves, our neighbors and even fellow members of the Body of Christ.

Fortunately for us though God has shown us through His Word how we are to reconcile with one another. The famous Matthew 18 verses 15 and 16 which state "15" If your brother or sister [b] sins, [c] go and point out their fault, just between the two of you. If they listen to you, you have won them over. 16 But if they will not listen, take one or two others along, so that 'every matter may be established by the testimony of two or three witnesses.' [d] 17 If they still refuse to listen, tell it to the church;"

Now, this verse is rightly seen as a conflict resolution verse. But it is more than that. It is the blueprint on how people can reconcile their differences with one another. If a Christian has a problem with another brother or sister they are to speak with them first. Maybe there has been a misunderstanding? Maybe someone misspoke? But if that is not the case then you are to bring two or three brothers or sisters to mediate a reconciliation. This is done for a twofold reason, maybe you will find out from your brothers and sisters that you were wrong, and then you will be reconciled. Or they will act as witnesses towards the other. Hoping to stop them from becoming intraignsent in their sin.

Finally, after the first two steps are taken, then you are to go to the Church as a whole. Again, you do this because you might find out you were wrong and then become reconciled, or if you are not, perhaps the pressure being brought to bear by the Church on your sinning brother or sister will be enough to bring them to reconciliation and repentance.

Our Lord provided us with the method by which we are to reconcile ourselves with others. Now sometimes people will not be reconciled. They will not repent, but most of the time if these guidelines are followed they will be.

During this time of Lent let us resolve when we have disputes to follow the Biblical method of conflict resolution. In fact let us strive to do so all year around. Because it is far better to be reconciled to a brother than estranged from one. Amen



A Lenten History Lesson:

Though the date of Easter varies, the majority of the Lenten season occurs during March. In fact, the word Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon words lenctentid (meaning "March") and lencten (meaning "spring").

The first reference to Lent dates back to 325 AD, in one of the 20 canons decreed at the council of Nicaea. By the eighth century, Christians started observing Lent, and a 10th-century monk named Aelfric connected the use of ashes and "the Lenten fast" to the pre-Easter period.


Lent lasts 40 days to represent Jesus' time in the wilderness, when he was tempted by the devil. The six Sundays that occur between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday aren't counted as part of Lent; instead, as the traditional day of worship, they're considered "mini-Easters."
