Blessings From our Father God and risen Lord Jesus Christ. Amen. Well, it is Halloween time and soon we will be seeing our young, and not so young, children and grandchildren playing dress up for Halloween. We will see them dressed up as princesses and fairies, witches and little monsters. It will be cute, but sometimes we will be tempted to think, when they are being particularly bratty or selfish, "Well, THAT Freddy Kruger costume or witch costume sure fits them to a tee." It is then that we will need to remember that even though they might be acting like the monster they are dressed as, that they were still created in the Imago Deo. Which is fancy pants pastor talk for: the image of God.

Yes, according to Genesis 1:27 God created us in His image. Not as an exact copy. We were not created to be gods, but in His likeness, in His image. Now, with our rightful focus on our fallen sin filled nature, a nature that was twisted and bent by the fall and has distorted the image we were created in. Sometimes we forget that underneath that distortion, underneath that sin that we were still made in the image of God. I think this is important for us to remember because in our rightful sorrow at the sins we see committed in the world and the sins we commit; we often turn the Gospel into a "worm" theology. A theology that is based on the false notion that we are worthless scum: Unworthy of God's "chesed". That is - His loving kindness.

This is not the case. God still cares for us and loves us despite our sins. He wants to restore us to what He originally created: His image. This is why He sent His Son to die for those beings that He created in His image, you and me, so that He could restore us, and make us into the perfect creation He always intended for us to be.

Let us remember that this October and every month of the year: We are God's Children, even when we are being sinful, even when our kids are being brats. We were created in His image, and although that has been distorted by sin, by the grace of God through Jesus Christ we will be restored to that original state when we come into our glory.

All thanks to our brother and Savior, Jesus Christ. Remember this while you open the door to those snotty little kids dressed up as ghoulies and monsters come October 31st. That yes, even they were created in His image and will one day be restored to His image if they believe in His Son. Amen

These are sent to a school in Nevada where they are recycled and made into new cards. If you have cards and don't have time to tear the fronts off, don't worry. We will take care of that for you.



Every day, life presents opportunities to help someone in need. Dare to be generous, for it is in giving that we receive.



Thanks to all your wonderful donations and some fund raisers, we now have beautiful new, safe doors to the church and the parish hall. We appreciate our Trustees coordinating this effort.

But, now it's time to turn to another much needed project. As you may notice, Pastor is now unable to use his lapel microphone or any other portable object so the only method is the lectern or the pulpit mikes. This makes hearing quite difficult when prayers are being said. Our system has been in effect for so many years and has finally failed completely.

With much research, it was presented to the Voter's Assembly and passed that we update the entire system not only for efficiency but for safety as well. As mentioned, a lot of research was done to get the best system that would serve our needs not only now but in the future. Therefore, a down payment of \$2,000 will be given to Christian Sound services for the installation of new speakers, microphones and electrical system.

The total cost of the project is \$30,540 which will come from our LCEF Stewardship account. LWML has donated \$5,000, a family has donated their memorial monies and the rest will come in donations as did the organ refurbishment and new doors among other things.

If you would like to contribute toward this project please write "<u>sound system fund</u>" in the memo part of your check or specify on your offering envelope how much you'd like to donate. It was suggested that families check to see if they have memorial funds remaining that they would like to add. We thank you so very much for supporting this project and know you will appreciate how clear and precise sound will be from Pastor, the choirs and other service additions.



Marilyn Olof reports that Marvin and Shirley Schaus have volunteered to collect the fronts of greeting cards and then send to St. Jude's Ranch for Children in Boulder City, NV. If you have any questions about what to cut or not cut, check with Marilyn or Shirley.
